
Hinckley | est. 2012

What we do

At Shooting Stars Nurseries, we provide the highest quality of childcare in a safe, nurturing and inclusive environment. Your child will enjoy a rich, exciting nursery experience which will have a positive influence on their learning and development. Through our child-centred learning approach, our staff team facilitate a varied blend of planned activities and free play, both indoors and outdoors, alongside other children the same age. All areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) are given equal coverage to ensure children receive a well-rounded early education.

Our childcare rooms and gardens are spacious, light, calm and inspiring, primed with opportunities ready to be discovered by the children each day. Awe, wonder and joy await each and every child as they explore their unique fascinations and interests through play.

From your child's first day right through to their Preschool Graduation, our friendly team are here to support your family, every step of the way.



Starting and settling

When starting nursery or moving from another setting, we provide plenty of support to ease the transition for young children and parents alike. Our bespoke, gentle settling in programme gives your child the time to become familiar with their Key Person and surroundings before their first full session.



Keeping track with Eylog

We use the eyLog app for sharing information between home and nursery. We post observations to each child's learning journey and log daily basic care data. Developmental progress is observed, logged and reviewed regularly to help us identify where a child might benefit from more support or challenge.

You can upload photos and videos from home too!



Parent partnership

We strongly believe that when parents and Practitioners work together, the results have an immensely positive impact on each child's learning and development. We value communication with parents at every opportunity, whether as a scheduled formal Parent Partnership meeting or as a quick, informal chat at pick up.



Room transitions

When your child is ready to move up, they will start to spend time playing in their new room with a small group of their peers. We also encourage parents to arrange a Working in Partnership meeting with their existing and new Key Person, to share information and plan to facilitate a smooth transition.



School Readiness

We support the children in developing all the skills they need to be independent and ready to learn when they join Reception. Our staff team works closely with parents, the local authority and local schools to ensure our Preschoolers graduate feeling ready to spread their wings at 'Big School'. Our unique pedagogy

Pedagogy is defined simply as the method and practice of teaching. Our pedagogy is how we approach delivering the content of the curriculum to the children. At Shooting Stars, we recognise that all children are different and unique so we don't follow a prescriptive 'one size fits all' approach to teaching. Instead, we favour an approach which is adaptable, varied and inclusive of the many ways in which different children learn. We've developed our own bespoke, in-house '5 Star' pedagogy by combining key principles and inspiration from a number of respected learning theorists and

approaches, including Steiner, Froebel, Montessori and Reggio Emilia. Our '5 Star' pedagogy is driven by 5 fundamental principles, or stars, that guide our approach;



Our '5 Star' pedagogy explained...



The best Nursery Practitioners never stop learning and that's why our team have access to a wide range of in-house and external training opportunities. We focus on continuous professional development, inspiring leadership and management, a strong, accountable safeguarding culture and exceptional customer service.



Well-being

Well-being is fundamental to the overall health of children and high levels of both well-being and engagement allow children to experience deep learning. Our Key Person approach means that each child has a nominated staff member dedicated to protecting and prioritising their well-being.



Enabling environments

Our nurseries are designed to be uncluttered, light and spacious, and are furnished in neutral tones, creating a calming, purposeful play environment. Our indoor and outdoor environments are designed to enable children the space, choice and opportunity to explore their own unique fascinations and interests without sensory overwhelm and clutter.



Inquiry-based learning

Resources which are open-ended, movable and can be used in a variety of ways offer the widest range of benefits to children, encouraging exploratory play, imagination and creativity. We provide opportunities for children to become more confident and autonomous problem-solvers and thinkers as they discover and 'learn by doing'.



Parent partnership

We know that strong, effective partnerships with children's families are some of the most valuable tools in 'getting it right' for them. We work in close partnership with parents to ensure regular 2-way communication. Our Key Person system ensures each family has a nominated Nursery Practitioner dedicated to supporting the best outcomes for their child.



An enabling environment

In order to increase engagement, each base room is carefully planned to create defined accessible zones or spaces for different types of play and learning to take place. Our zones offer children familiarity and consistency, as they can easily locate and access resources for themselves (and tidy them away!), which empowers them and helps to support their developing independence. Resources are moveable between zones, giving children the flexibility to transport and combine resources from multiple areas to develop their play as they choose. Resources can then be returned to their 'home', ready to be played with again.

The zones and the way they are resourced ensure that the seven areas of learning within the EYFS are reflected in the provision, so that children can access a wide variety of learning opportunities throughout each day. The layout and resourcing of each base room environment is different, but typically contains a broad selection of the following zones:

Loose parts & natural materials | Sensory | Water & Sand | Messy & Maleable | Musical Creative/mark-making | Small world & construction | Role play/home corner Physical play & climbing | Cosy area/quiet space | Carpet area/gathering space | Reading & literacy | Maths & numeracy | Scientific investigation | Information Technology












All 7 areas of the EYFS are considered important and interconnected. Three prime areas are particularly important for building a foundation for learning, forming relationships and thriving:







We also support the children in four specific areas, through which the three prime areas are strengthened and applied.









Time for sleep

The nursery day is full of lots of opportunity for social, physical and educational fun but the majority of babies and many young children still need to take some down time during the day to rest, refresh and recharge. We provide cots and coracles with bedding in the baby room and sleep mats and blankets in all other rooms. We follow safe sleeping guidelines to ensure the children are safe at all times.

The amount of daytime sleep children need tends to decrease with age but every child is different. We continue established home sleep routines at nursery as far as possible and we will keep you updated as to how your child's natural nursery sleep pattern evolves as they grow.

Daily Routine

Children feel settled and thrive in an environment that is familiar and secure, and an important aspect of creating this feeling is the familiarity of a daily routine. A day at Shooting Stars flows from 7:30am until 6pm with a blend of child-led exploration and adult-guided learning, indoor and outdoor play, small/large group activities and individual focused activities to create a well-balanced learning experience.

A typical day*

*At Shooting Stars, every day is different! For illustrative purposes, the above routine is an example of how a typical day might unfold, but please note that curriculum delivery, activities and timings are flexible and vary widely day-to-day based around the children's changing needs and interests.



Nursery essentials

Each child is allocated a named peg and tray for their belongings at nursery. You are welcome to store a set of seasonal items at nursery for ease (one less thing to remember!)

Please bring a bag containing:

- Prescription medication to be signed in at reception
- At least 2 changes of clothes (more if toilet training), including pants and socks
- Wipes, nappy cream and nappies (at least 5 for full day / 3 for half day)
- Seasonal coat/jacket
- Wellies (all year)
- Hat, gloves and scarf (autumn/winter months)
- Sun hat and unopened sun cream of at least SPF 30+ and 4 Star UVA protection (spring/summer months)
- · Comforter, if required

All food, snacks, drinks and toys are provided by nursery so please leave these at home.

Remember to dress your child in comfortable clothes that you don't mind getting wet or dirty.

We encourage children to wear aprons for art, messy and wet play but sometimes they get there before we do!




Healthy, home-cooked food





We strongly believe that healthy eating in the early years helps to form a good foundation on which to build a healthy lifestyle and positive attitudes towards food as we grow up. A healthy diet supports growth and brain development, boosts immunity and provides energy and nutrients to help children stay active, healthy and happy. We provide healthy, nutritionally balanced meals and snacks to give the children the fuel they need for a busy day of learning, freshly prepared each day in our on-site kitchens.


We cater for special dietary requirements, including allergies, intolerances, sensory needs and preferences on religious grounds. We also guide babies through their weaning journey with freshly prepared purees, before gradually adding more texture, variety and finger foods as they develop.






Family-style meal service

We encourage 'family-style' self-service, under the guidance and supervision of the staff team, enabling the children to learn the skills they need to become social, caring and patient diners. The lunch tables at nursery are welcoming and support independence.



Fine motor skills, social skills, patience and sharing are developed and embedded



The older children use crockery and metal cutlery, lay the table and clear their own plates



Self-regulation of portion size and children learn how to make healthy food choices

Food education & exploration

We integrate food education as part of the children's normal nursery day. This is achieved by involving them in the exploration of different foods, discovering new textures and tastes, discussing foods with their peers and staff, and in cooking/food preparation activities.

Meal times present a multitude of opportunities for initiating conversations around our personal preferences and making healthy choices, whilst also enjoying those yummy treats in moderation!



This includes not only our dedicated team of childcare professionals but also our in-house support staff who play a vital role in upholding quality standards in the delivery of our childcare services;

- Our maintenance team; who ensure our buildings, gardens and equipment are safe and secure for the children to use.
- Our cleaning team; who ensure the highest standards of cleanliness are upheld daily, enabling our childcare staff to focus on the children.
- Our catering team; who adhere strictly to Food Hygiene standards and dietary requirements, ensuring the children are kept safe when eating at nursery.





Our People

We understand that any nursery, indeed any organisation, is only as good as the people within it. Shooting Stars Nurseries are committed to ensuring that all our staff share our ethos and are passionate about their role.

Safer Recruitment & Employment

The safety and well-being of the children is our number one priority and through our robust Safer Recruitment Procedures, we ensure that our team are appropriately qualified and committed to delivering the highest level of service you expect for your child.

Each room is supervised by appropriately qualified staff based on the required staff: child ratio for each age group.

- Aged under 2 years: 1 staff member to 3 children
- Aged 2 years: 1 staff member to 4 children
- Aged 3+ years: 1 staff member to 8 children

Our Safer Employment Procedures also ensure that we encourage and support all staff to advance their professional qualifications to the fullest extent. Our staff training programmes are extensive, with courses arranged both externally and developed in-house to meet the needs and interests of our team.

Happy, thriving staff = Happy, flourishing children!

We believe that ensuring our staff are cared for helps to support them in caring deeply for the children. Shooting Stars Nursery Managers receive Mental Health training and each nursery has a Well-being Champion too. Our staff have 24/7 access to the Employee Assistance Programme should they need external confidential support or advice.

We also subsidise social events to bring the team together and recognise and reward staff who go the extra mile.
